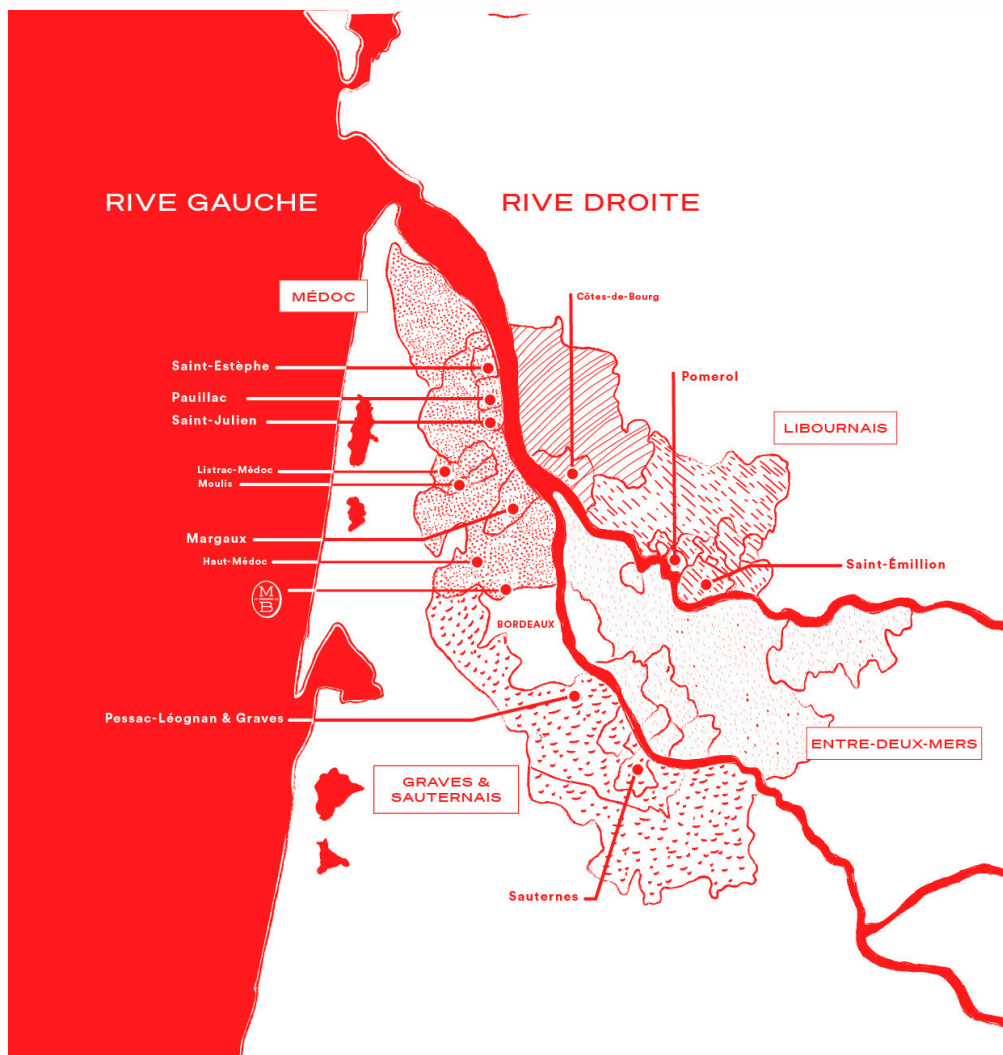

Hidden in a clearing surrounded by forest, Domaine de Chevalier is one of the most emblematic estates of the Graves region. Located in Léognan, just south of Bordeaux, this Grand Cru Classé produces both red and white wines of exceptional refinement and balance.

The origins of the estate date back to the 18th century, when it was known as Chivaley – the Gascon word for “chevalier.” Its reputation has grown steadily over the centuries, built on the quality of its gravel soils resting on a clay-gravel subsoil that provides perfect drainage and ideal ripening conditions.

Today, the vineyard covers 67 hectares, including 60 hectares planted with red grape varieties (63% Cabernet Sauvignon, 30% Merlot, 5% Petit Verdot and 2% Cabernet Franc) and 7 hectares of white vines (70% Sauvignon Blanc, 30% Sémillon).

Since 1983, the estate has been owned and managed by the Bernard family, with Olivier Bernard at the helm. Under his direction, Domaine de Chevalier has undergone extensive renovation and modernization, combining traditional craftsmanship with a forward-looking vision.

By the Laveau family in the 18th century, the estate cultivated over 100 hectares of various crops. Grand Mayne currently has just 17 hectares of vines, which have become the heart and soul of the estate. Growing in every direction around the Château, which seems to sit on a bed of green, over 100,000 vines cover the gentle slope with southwest sun exposure that catches the last of the setting sun's rays.

Grand Mayne is an authentic, but also a romantic place, where wine is made with an obsession for perfection and adapted to the complex terroir. There is no need to spell out the techniques – it is sufficient to taste the wine to imagine them...

The Nony family has presided over Grand Mayne's destinies since 1934. Jean-Antoine represents the third generation – after Jean, then Jean-Pierre and his wife Marie-Françoise – to perpetuate family management, resolutely turned towards excellence.

Château Troplong-Mondot is a prestigious Grand Cru Classé in Saint-Émilion, renowned for its powerful, rich, and elegant wines. Situated on an ideal clay-limestone terroir, the estate combines traditional know-how with modern viticulture and winemaking techniques.

The château takes its name from the Mondot family, who greatly contributed to its renown. Its wines are distinguished by their structure, aromatic concentration, and aging potential, offering a perfect balance of power and finesse.

The estate itself, with its elegant architecture and well-maintained vineyards, reflects the prestige and history of Saint-Émilion, making Troplong-Mondot one of the most respected crus in the region.

Located in the communes of Macau and Ludon, Château Cantemerle, designated a great growth in the famous 1855 classification, has deep fine gravel soil. Thanks to its unique terroir, Cantemerle produces complex, well-balanced, and refined wines.

After belonging to the Villeneuve (1576-1892) and Dubos (1892-1980) families, the château was acquired in 1981 by the SMABTP, a large mutual insurance company in the construction and civil engineering sector. The estate's long history is reflected in the château's distinctive architecture and the magnificent grounds that surround it. Cantemerle exudes romantic charm, and the vineyard has a magical feel to it.

Attractive even when quite young, the wine is rich, powerful, and smooth. It is made by and experienced and enthusiastic team using a careful blend of traditional and state-of-the-art techniques.

CHATEAU D'ISSAN
MARGAUX

Two estates have dominated the Margaux region throughout the centuries: Lamothe-Margaux and the Lamothe-Cantenac, known today as Château Margaux and Château d'Issan. The reference to Château d'Issan dates back to the 12th century when our wine was officially served during the wedding of Alienor of Aquitaine with Henry II, King of England in 1152. This was one of the first link between the wine trade between Bordeaux and England.

Château d'Issan has always been family owned. The Essenault family owned the Chateau during 5 generations and rebuilt the existing Château at the end of the XVIth century. It is one of the oldest Château in Bordeaux, nowadays registered at the French Historical Patrimony.

In the 19th century, Château d'Issan, with its splendid vineyards of 45 hectares in Margaux Appellation, has been listed in the famous 1855 Classification as a Grand Cru Classé. In 1945, the Cruse family, already established in the Médoc for more than 150 years, purchased the property and revealed its true potential. Today, Emmanuel Cruse runs the estate with true passion and continue to make improvements in both the vineyards and the technical aspects of winemaking.

In 2013, the owner of Château Pedesclaux (Grand Cru Classé in 1855 – Pauillac) and Château Lilian Ladouys (Cru Bourgeois – St Estephe) the Lorenzetti family has joined the Cruse family in the Château d'Issan adventure.

CHATEAU MARQUIS D'ALESME

Located in the heart of the Margaux appellation, Château Marquis d'Alesme Becker is a prestigious Médoc estate, classified as a Third Growth (Troisième Grand Cru Classé) in 1855. Founded in the 18th century by the Marquis d'Alesme, the property is now owned by the Perrodo family, who have skillfully combined tradition and innovation to restore its full splendor.

The 15-hectare vineyard, planted mainly with Cabernet Sauvignon and Merlot, lies on fine gravel soils typical of Margaux. The wines are renowned for their elegance, aromatic finesse, and silky tannins, perfectly expressing the refined character of the appellation. The château also stands out for its unique architecture, blending Bordeaux elegance with Asian influences — a symbol of harmony and cultural openness. Today, Château Marquis d'Alesme represents a perfect balance between heritage, elegance, and modernity, crafting wines of true distinction.

Contiguous to Château Margaux and Château Lascombes, this estate is mentioned in the 1868 edition by Édouard Féret, which records the existence since 1332 of “the lands of the house of Noble de La Bégorce.” The château is described as “...one of the most beautiful and best located in the commune of Margaux.”

Since its acquisition in 1989, the Perrodo family has restored the estate’s architectural splendor and brought renewed viticultural dynamism, giving rise at Labégorce to a charming wine with excellent structure, vibrant fruit, and great finesse.

The Perrodo family also acquired Château Marquis d’Alesme, a Third Growth of Margaux, in 2006, with the aim, once again, of elevating this cru to the level of the appellation’s finest estates.

Château La Tour de Mons is a single-block estate, a true enclosed vineyard, located in the northern part of the Margaux appellation, on the banks of the Garonne, like the greatest Médoc growths.

The history of La Tour de Mons dates back to 1098, with the creation of the seigneurie of Soussans by Guillaume IX the Troubadour, Duke of Aquitaine and Count of Poitiers and Gascony.

In 2020, Château La Tour de Mons was acquired from CA Grands Crus by the Perrodo family, already owners of Château Labégorce Margaux and Château Marquis d'Alesme, a Grand Cru Classé in 1855, both located in close proximity to Château La Tour de Mons.”

In the mid-2010s, the DOMAINES P team was inspired to produce an unusual white wine. Starting from a blank page, the quest for the ideal blend was guided by Nathalie Perrodo's whimsy and Marjolaine de Coninck's vision.

Beyond the joy of this project, it was the occasion for numerous tastings and wonderful discoveries.

The Chardonnays were planted in 2017, slowly followed by Albarino and Petit Manseng.

In May 2024, the first bottle of Saam Long was offered to guests at La Table de Nathalie.

This spirit of this prestigious great growth was forged over three centuries.

During the reign of Henri III, Beychevelle was the fief of the Dukes of Épernon, including the first of that name, Jean-Louis Nogaret de La Valette, an admiral in the French navy. According to legend, ships passing in front of his château lowered their sails as a sign of allegiance to this powerful man.

In fact, the name Beychevelle comes from the Old French Baisse-Voile, meaning “lowered sails”, as reflected in the château emblem. This depicts a ship with a griffin - the guardian of Dionysus’ wine crater in Greek mythology - on the prow.

Built in the 17th century and reconstructed by Marquis de Brassier in 1757, “the Versailles of the Médoc” was restored to its original splendor in the late 20th century. The elegance of Beychevelle’s architecture is reflected in its refined, well-balanced wine served at prestigious tables around the world.

The management is also very respectful of the environment, and the estate has been certified for sustainable viticulture. Herbicides have been banned for 6 years, a large part of the vineyard is organically grown, and the property is soon to be certified ISO 14001.

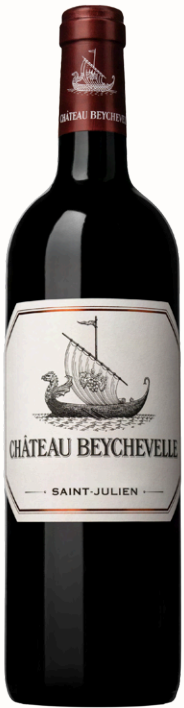

The history of Lagrange dates back to 1796, when it was acquired by Count Jean Valère Cabarrus, Napoleon's Finance Minister in Spain. He expanded the estate by purchasing numerous vineyards plots and remained the owner until 1825. Château Lagrange was classified a third growth in 1855.

In 1983, the Suntory group, the leading Japanese wine and spirits firm, acquired Lagrange and invested heavily in a spectacular renovation. Priority was given to the vineyard, followed by refurbishing and modernising the vat room and cellars.

Today, Lagrange has 118 hectares of vines. Efforts undertaken since the 1980's include plot-by-plot vineyard management and separate fermentation of grapes from each of these plots in order to fine tune the final blend. This results in a powerful, elegant wine with great ageing potential year in, year out. Château Lagrange is also one of the rare estates in the Médoc to produce a white wine: Les Arums de Lagrange.

Above and beyond their focus on quality, Matthieu Bordes and his team also show great respect for the environment in everything they do.

Château Pichon Baron is one of the most prestigious Pauillac wines and a majestic property on the Left Bank in the Bordeaux region. Located on the Médoc "Route des Châteaux" (the Castle Road), this Second Classified Growth of 1855 leaves no one indifferent. The estate's imposing structure is reflected with grandeur and brilliance in the water mirror that rests just in front of it, and under this water mirror is the château's underground cellar. "Pichon Baron" underwent major modernization once it entered under the control of the AXA Group at the end of the 1980s. With modern infrastructure and a vineyard largely replanted, Château Pichon Baron has reached a peak of excellence that matches the First Great Classified Growths. With a mosaic of terroirs and ideally located near the Gironde estuary, the Pichon Baron vineyard covers 73 hectares of vines growing in perfectly drained Médoc gravel soils.

Château Cos d'Estournel is one of the most emblematic estates of Saint-Estèphe and a striking landmark of Bordeaux's Left Bank. Classified as a Second Growth in 1855, the estate is instantly recognizable by its exotic, pagoda-style architecture inspired by the travels of its founder, Louis-Gaspard d'Estournel, the “Maharajah of Saint-Estèphe.”

A pioneer in innovation, Cos d'Estournel combines tradition with cutting-edge techniques, including its renowned gravity-flow winery. This commitment to excellence places the château among the most visionary estates in the Médoc.

Overlooking the Gironde estuary, the vineyard spans 100 hectares of deep, well-drained gravel soils ideal for Cabernet Sauvignon. This exceptional terroir produces wines of great depth, power, and precision—wines that stand among the finest of Bordeaux.

SAUTERNES - Premier Grand Cru Classé

With a history dating back to the 17th century and boasting gardens designed by Le Notre, the Chateau was classified as a First Growth in 1855. Today, Chateau Suduiraut's vineyards stretch over 92 hectares and are planted with 90% Semillon and 10% Sauvignon Blanc. The sand-gravel soil and its location within the appellation make the Chateau's vineyards the ideal environment for The Noble Rot—resulting in wines that have a harmonious combination of luscious fruit and flower aromas.

AXA Millésimes acquired Château Suduiraut in 1992 with the aim of preserving and perpetuating the estate's remarkable tradition of vineyard management and winemaking. Inspired by the great Suduiraut wines of the past, the new management has enabled this great vineyard to fulfil its full potential in recent years.

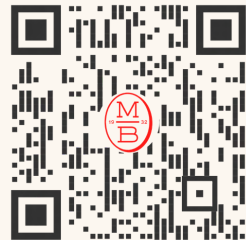
